- Connect with water justice organizations in your community
- Become "water literate;" learn about & teach others about regional water policies and how to prioritize & protect water
- Use water conserving appliances; purchase products that don't contaminate water
- Volunteer to protect clean water through river, lake, and beach cleanups
- Support local wetlands: act.ilenviro.org/a/wetlands & Drawdown Project: coastal wetland protection

- Don't overfertilize your lawn or garden
- Support organizations such as International Tribunal for the Rights of Nature, Global Alliance for the Rights of Nature, and others.
- Learn about the Rights of Nature via the UN Water Conference
